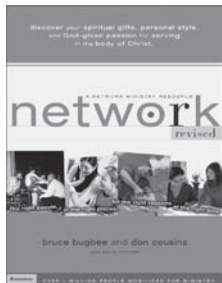


FINANCIAL PEACE UNIVERSITY

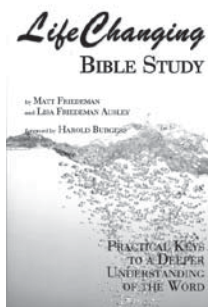
Course begins February 19. Will meet Sunday, 9:30 a.m., in Room 912.
