



LOVE AT WORK is a growing ministry of Killearn United Methodist Church in Tallahassee, Florida that was founded twelve years ago. The youth mission project was designed to help residents of nearby Gadsden County who reside in substandard housing. Love At Work has been recognized by the local community as an example of service and compassion. Participants work Monday through Friday repairing homes and working in the community. Work crews go out into the community where they replace roofs, build wheelchair ramps, replace siding, repaint homes and build porches, as well as working with children doing Vacation Bible School activities in the neighborhoods. All work is done free of cost to the home owners as a gift of love and compassion in the name of God. During the evenings, youth attend worship, play games and enjoy Christian Fellowship. Love At Work is an intense week of spiritual growth and service.

Guidelines for Conduct
